FALL 2023 PROGRAM SCHEDULE

PUBLIC MEETINGS are the first Tuesday of each month (unless otherwise stated) at the

Reily Township Community Center 6093 Reily Millville Rd., Oxford, Ohio 45056

The organization business meeting starts at 7PM and is followed by the prescheduled speaker or displays.

Tuesday, September 5, 2023 - Valerie Elliott co-author "Homes of Old Oxford: An Album of Photographs by Frank R. Snyder and Others," will share historical information and photographs of Oxford's most iconic homes in the early 20th century. "Homes of Oxford" features 75 houses and highlights the town's history and people. Prior to our presenter, author Daniel D. Schneider will offer a brief insight into his latest work, "Haunted Butler County, Ohio." Following the session, you'll have the chance to acquire his book, which will be on sale after the meeting.

Tuesday, October 3, 2023 - Dick Oertel "The Name Sample Keeps Popping Up" is a retired P&G chemist, amateur local historian and Butler County resident for 54 years. This presentation will report on several areas of local historical research covering the period from about 1820 to 1930. Although the work involves a number of well-known families, one name alone—Sample—repeatedly appears. Included will be some delightful recollections of life in Reily village around 1900 from a longtime Sample Road resident, and some findings regarding an intriguing set of 1908 camp photos that were

donated recently to Reily's Hammond House Museum by a

Sample family descendant.

Wednesday, November 15, 2023 - Alex Zomchek

Alex is a lifelong beekeeper and honey bee researcher. He has several latitudinal bee labs ranging from Canada down to Florida to extend his yearly "bee-time". His presentation is, "Honey Bee Retrospective – 50+ Years in the Hive". This will include a brief 200 million years history, some local history, the state of the state – the goods/bads, plus a little science future/fiction. He will end with things that you can do in your own back yards to promote bee health. Bring you curiosity and questions!

Gordon Lee Rardon

1934-2023

Gordon was scheduled to speak at our September meeting. It is with great regret that we say goodbye to Gordon. He took pleasure sharing his knowledge of Reily Township with us in the form of wonderfully prepared presentations.

Gordon Lee Rardon, age 88 of Centerville, passed away Thursday, August 10, 2023. He was born December 12, 1934 in Reily Township, Ohio, the son of the late Smith and Viola Rardon. Gordon served his country in the United States Army. He attended Wilmington and Earlham College and was a member of the Sigma Zeta Fraternity. Gordon had a long Career as a Mechanical Engineer and worked for Lau Industries for over 40 years. After retirement he went back to work for Hillrom Corp. He served his community in a number of ways by volunteering for Junior Achievement at his work, being an active member of the Lions Club for years, and Volunteering at the Air Force Museum. He was a member of the First



Baptist Church of Kettering and served as an usher for years. Gordon was a woodworker and would build things he thought up in his head. He had green thumb and loved working in his flower garden and he enjoyed feeding the birds, especially hummingbirds. He had a Lifelong fascination with Aviation. Gordon was a story teller and if you talked to him you would hear a good story. He was a loving husband, father and grandfather and he will be missed by all who knew him.
